#### St. Francis Women's Group Topics Discussed During Afternoon Tea Friday, June 21, 2024

The St. Francis Women's Group held its inaugural event on Friday, June 21st afternoon tea hosted by Mimi Lawless. We had 22 attendees, including Father Lucey and his wife Katherine. Mimi laid out an incredible spread and set a high bar for future Women's Group events. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves. We socialized, ate finger foods, and drank iced tea, water, or a bit of prosecco. The group also gathered to discuss issues of concern to the Women's Group.

1. **Fall Marketplace October 19, 2024** - the Women's Group will be in charge of the Treasure Trove section of the Fall Marketplace. We will request donations, sort and price everything, then sell it all. Proceeds will benefit St. Francis. Members of the Women's Group are in charge of other portions of the Marketplace. Carmela Condro is in charge of attracting vendors/crafters. Jennifer Murphy is in charge of baskets to be auctioned and is looking for at least one other person to help her. Kris Young and Michelle Bias will run the bake sale.

2. **Melanie Sisson's flower cutting event** - Melanie was unable to attend but previously had said she's waiting to see how/if the hot weather will affect her flower beds before she sets a date. She's looking to schedule during cooler weather, such as in late July or August.

3. Amelia Logan brought up the idea of the **Women's Group touring the National Cathedral.** It was suggested to expand this event to the entire congregation of St. Francis. Amelia said she would look into a private tour.

4. Sharon Callaway won the On-line Auction **"Pickleball Party at the Eldridge Residence,"** and, with Mimi and Brice Eldridge's consent, has volunteered to use it to host a Women's Group Pickleball Party. This new event remains unscheduled. It was suggested to hold it in September or sometime this Fall when the weather is cooler. All would be welcome, players and non-players.

5. Ginger Gotliffe wanted to know if calling the group "the St. Francis Women's Group" is set in stone. Could we call it something else, perhaps along the lines of the various guilds or something more biblical. Jennifer Murphy suggested the Women's Guild. We decided to think of options. New name suggestions will be emailed to Janet Durfee and/or Annette Bellino.

6. Regarding Father Lucey's replacement, little could be said other than the search continues. Ginger Gotliffe said **the Altar Guild will host the farewell party for Father Lucey.** Members of the Women's Group suggested that the Group host a welcome reception for the new Priest in charge on a Sunday soon after he/she arrives.

7. Lynda Davis offered to facilitate a discussion among the Women's Group, the IWC and relevant Vestry liaisons on **how best to work together**. St. Francis hosts many events throughout the year, and there is value in a process that can help prioritize projects, include all interested parishioners, coordinate contributions, identify and manage needed resources, communicate positive benefits, and ensure sustainment when needed.

8. A request was made as to the best way to submit suggestions and questions to the Women's Group. For the time being, email your questions and suggestions to Janet Durfee and Annette Bellino. Regarding Women's Group updates, they will be done via group emails and the weekly St. Francis emails. The various ways St. Francis uses to communicate are currently being evaluated and/or updated. The Women's Group will be able to utilize these methods once they are in place. Elizabeth Kim said the website update is progressing and that space will be allocated for the Women's Group. This is topic that the group will discuss in the future.

9. Annette Bellino noted that it would be nice if the Women's Group could attract teenage and college-aged women and that the group could act as mentors. Sometimes it is easier to talk with someone that is not your mother or a teacher. This idea morphed into several different threads regarding mentorship for middle school, high school, and college-aged students. One line of thought was to

host college and career fairs for all students in our area. Ideas of how to get younger members interested in the Women's Group are requested.

10. Mimi Eldridge reminded everyone to participate in the **Rise Against Hunger's Pathways to End Hunger on October 4th at St. Francis**. It will be a community event to package 15,120 meals that will go to school children in communities that lack access to food. The Great Falls Rotary will help with set up.


