A Message from our Music Director

Franciscans,

It is wonderful to be back in full swing with the new program year. Also, a great pleasure to welcome Weston into our midst as priest-in charge. I am especially excited about his enthusiasm for music at St. Francis and look forward to many new musical adventures going forward.

Regarding music for this fall there are some new elements that we will add to our Sunday liturgies. One of them is the restoration of the processional and recessional by the altar party and choir. We will process into the sanctuary accompanied by Sasha's prelude and follow it with the opening hymn and will recess following the post communion hymn and blessing.

Another new element will be a "Call to Worship" that will be sung by the Choir or

elements thereof. It will precede the prelude/procession and is designed to encourage congregants to to become focused on the liturgy that will begin momentarily. There will be a variety of genres of music presented at this time with the hope that it will aid in this task. We hope this will be an enjoyable " coming together moment" for all as we begin the Sunday liturgy.

I ask that you mark two dates on your calendars that will feature special music at St. Francis. The first is **All Saints Sunday, November 3rd**. At the **10 am service** the Choir accompanied by an instrumental ensemble will sing *Requiem* by John Rutter. It will be integrated into the service with slides of those who have recently passed being shown during the movements sung during the offertory and communion meditation. This will be the third year that we have celebrated All Saints in this manner. Each time has been a moving and prayerful experience. Rutter's music is especially poignant on this subject. Plan to be present and if possible bring a friend.

The other date to mark is **Saturday**, **December 7**, **at 3 pm**, when we will present a special Advent Concert which will include the singing of some of our favorite Advent hymns, poetry and the performance with orchestra. and soloists of J. S. Bach's immortal Advent Cantata 140 - Sleepers Awake (Wachet Auf). Not only will this be a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the season of Advent through music and poetry, it will be a time to invite others in our local community to attend a function at St. Francis. This program is designed to be about 60-70 minutes in duration.

Finally, if you or someone you know is interested and experienced in choral singing, I am always happy to discuss the possibilities of singing in our parish choir. The Choir performs a great service to the Parish and is a substantial commitment of time, but the rewards are great and the camaraderie of the group is excellent.
