

Annual Meeting Notice: Voting Instructions &

Vestry Candidates for Election at the January 19, 2025 Annual Congregational Meeting of St. Francis

Please note that your Vestry candidate vote must take place in person at St. Francis on Sunday, January 19th. This is according to the Episcopal Canons.

**0** Voter Eligibility for an Adult (16+) is determined as follows:

1. If you have contributed financially at least once to St. Francis Church in 2024; and

2. If you have attended at least one service at St. Francis Church in 2024

**0** Ballots will be distributed to persons at the 8:00 a.m. service who are not able to stay for the Annual Meeting at 11:30 a.m.

**o** If you unable to attend the Annual Meeting, you may not vote remotely nor submit an absentee ballot for this election.

**0** After the 10:00 a.m. service, at 11:15 a.m. ballots will be available in the Narthex for voting. Completed ballots will be placed into the ballot box before entering the Sanctuary in preparation for the 11:30 a.m. Annual Meeting.

Poll workers will be working as ballot counters after all votes have been cast.

# Newcomers' Brunch: Sunday, January 26th


