Linda Calkins has served in over 10 parishes in the past 20 years in a variety of positions from Associate to long term supply, Interim to Rector, predominantly in the Diocese of Washington but also in Vermont. Most recently she served as Interim at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, College Park for almost 2 years.

Linda is retired, and licensed in both the Diocese of Washington and the Diocese of Virginia. Linda has



enjoyed serving as a supply priest at St. Francis and offered a unique Stations of the Cross service on Good Friday this year. She lives close to family in Reston with her wife Susan and four pets.

Dr. Michael Hattwick

Dr. Michael Hattwick is a Franciscan, a doctor, poet, teacher, writer, husband, and father. Michael was born in Illinois, raised in Houston, Texas, and educated at Harvard, Georgetown, and the University of London. He has been a student and teacher of the Western Spiritual Tradition for many years. In 2010, he published "The ABBA Tradition," a book about the spiritual and mystical tradition that lies deep within and behind Judaism and Christianity.



At Harvard, he was a member of the David Reisman freshman Seminars, majored in Chemistry and Physics, and studied Western civilization with Paul Tillich for two years. In 1962, he joined a seminar taught by Timothy Leary, Richard Alpert (aka later Ram Dass), and Ralph Metzner. He went with them to their summer school in Zihuatanejo, Mexico, and then traveled to Europe, where he met his wife. In 1963, he returned to Harvard and graduated Cum Laude. He earned an MD from Baylor College of Medicine and continued his medical training at Georgetown University in DC General Hospital.

In 1995, Dr. Hattwick presented a paper titled "The ABBA Tradition" at the First International Kabbalah Society meeting in Toledo, Spain. That paper grew into the book "The ABBA Tradition," published in 2010.

Dr. Hattwick is married to Barbara Carr Hattwick who is also a faithful member of St. Francis. They have three children and two grandchildren and live in Great Falls.







Great News from the Pine Ridge Episcopal Mission!

The Rev. Michelle Dayton, Superintending Presbyter of the Pine Ridge Episcopal Mission in South Dakota has sent us great news. The Church of the Mediator in Kyle, SD opened in 1910; one of nine churches of the Diocese of South Dakota's mission on the Pine Ridge Reservation. The church has never had running water. The 2025 United Thank Offering (UTO, founded in 1889) cycle of grants focused on water, inspired by Jesus' words, "I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink." Mother Michelle applied for the maximum UTO grant of \$55K to obtain water and plumbing into the church for hand washing, toilets, and communion water. The parishioners were prepared hold bake sales and raffle off star quilts to make up the balance to reach \$69K necessary for the project. However, the Church of the Mediator's need was unprecedented, and the UTO awarded them \$69,050 to fund the entire project. The St. Francis Outreach Committee provided \$2500 seed money to the Mediator's water fund project in 2024.






